***Historic Preservation/ Aesthetics***

- Do the aesthetics make you want to stop and visit?
- Create an environment to attract visitors and pedestrian activities
- Embrace historic roots
- Need village theme streetscape
- Add traffic calming features
- Town/villages – need to enforce zoning and codes
- Street-lined trees should be extended beyond village limits
- Enforce or adopt building maintenance codes to promote village themes
- Visual image sets speed
- Maintain and promote unique historic Routes 5/20 character – “Oregon Trail”
- Compatible historic type signage
- Promote Seneca Indian thoroughfare

***Multi-modal***

- Need wide shoulders for bikes
- Encourage more bike use
- Do not widen roadway
- Place bike route signs
- Pavement markings
- Separate bikes and vehicles
