

● County - uniform data collection records that meet or exceed existing laws.
tied into permits (landfills/haulers).

• Stronger penalties for lack of compliance / landfill / haulers.

= follow DEZ reporting requirements (evaluation criteria)
County to set up criteria
transparent to public / report card.

● - Independent monitor

- increase tipping fees, to pay for programs

● consequences (stiff) for not meeting rules.

- * Clear identification of what is/isn't recyclable to reduce cost/time involved
- * ↑ quantity of recycling / larger bins
- * use trash trucks/haulers to advertise recycling - what is/isn't recyclable
- * hauler accountability

- * public events / County internal recycling bins promotions (FLCC^{ex.})
- * ↑ HHHW days - more friendly, inc. freq., more locations
