The Public Safety Committee met in the Ontario County Safety Training Facility on Monday, March 19, 2012 at 2 p.m. for a regularly scheduled meeting. The meeting was chaired by Supervisor Ninestine.

**Approval of Minutes:**

**Supervisor Luckern moved approval of the Minutes of the regular meeting held on February 27, 2012. Supervisor Teed seconded the motion, carried unanimously.**

**District Attorney's Office**

Mary Gates reported they had been notified by the Judicial Compensation Commission that the District Attorney's salary by Judiciary Law 183-a, has to be increased to \$160,000 and will take effect on April 1, 2012. Due to the fact that this was not budgeted for, a budget transfer of \$22,133.00 was necessary to cover the increase in pay for Mr. Tantillo.

**Supervisor Luckern moved approval as requested by Ms. Gates. Motion was seconded the Supervisor Champlin and carried unanimously.**

**STOP-DWI**

Mrs. Malavase reported on the annual STOP – DWI Program. Mrs. Malavase pointed out that as of February 2011, they only had 8.92% of the budget coming in, which was \$34,102. This year they had 20.21% of the budget, which was \$59,298. Mrs. Malavase reported that arrests were up over 15% this year for the same period of 2011.

**Planning Department:**

Mr. Harvey requested authorization to Establish Capital Project 4 – 2012, Next Generation 9-1-1 Switch Replacement.

**Supervisor Green moved approval as requested by Mr. Harvey, Supervisor Teed seconded the motion, carried unanimously.**

Mr. Harvey requested authorization for payment of the following bills, with the request that first invoice, American Tower, be removed as it was discovered it was paid last month.

- A. Communications International, P25 Upgrade, current payment due of \$986,409.48.
- B. L.R. Kimball, Invoice 513436, \$28,446.43, less retainage of \$2,844.64 for a total amount due of \$25,601.79
- C. NYSEG energy charges in the amount of \$40.65
- D. Jason Wagner Consulting services for a total of \$875.00
- E. RJ Schickler, Inc. Tower Contract in the amount of \$38,791.92.
- F. RJ Schickler, Inc. Electrical Contract in the amount of \$50,041.48
- G. RG& E Invoice for Victor Tower Site installation in the amount of \$327.50

**Supervisor Champlin moved approval as requested by Mr. Harvey, Supervisor Green seconded the motion, carried with four Committee members voting in favor and Supervisor Luckern opposing.**

Supervisor Teed said that he had been approached by highway superintendents with concerns to the radios they have in their vehicles and whether or not there is an option that could refit the radios they have as opposed to purchasing all new ones. Mr. Harvey said that a private company has come up with an option that services can be leased from them, so it is something being looked into.

**Probation Department:**

Ms. Donovan advised that the first report entitled NYS Commission of Correction Probation Report, was actually the Jail Population Report. Ms. Donovan advised that the Committee has asked to see this periodically. Ontario County has a 50%-50% split between unsentenced vs. sentenced inmates. It is excellent compared to other counties in the state. This is due to the people who work in the jail and probation keeping alternatives to incarceration going including pre-trial release. Supervisor Ninestine asked if this could be translated into financial terms as to how it is effecting. Ms. Gates said that she could certainly do this for the next meeting. Ms. Donovan said that it does fluctuate considerably.

Ms. Donovan updated the committee on the Ignition Interlock Device Statistical Report. Ms. Donovan reported that 483 cases had been received since August 15, 2010, and of those 349 were CD cases. Prior to the passing of Leandra's Law the Probation Department did not receive CD cases. As of 3/14/2012, there are 410 cases, not all have interlock ignition installed, and some people do not have a vehicle registered to them. Supervisor Ninestine asked if CD meant Conditional Discharge, and Ms. Donovan replied yes.

Ms. Donovan went over the Recidivism Report, which shows how Ontario County does compared to other counties in the state. Ontario County looks good overall compared to other counties.

Ms. Donovan requested authorization for 2012 ATI Advisory Board Appointments.

**Supervisor Luckern moved approval as requested by Ms. Donovan. Supervisor Champlin seconded the motion, carried unanimously**

**Office of Sheriff:**

Sheriff Povero reported on the jail revenue for the month of February, 2012, advising that \$3,995.00 was the total revenue for housing inmates. The average daily population was 191 in February, down from 208 in January. The population today was 179. The weekend high was 194. There are 28 inmates in the female Pod, Pod 7 has 42 adult males, and Pod 8 has 35 males. Sheriff Povero reported that there would be a bill from an inmate who was in the hospital recently and had to be guarded around the clock.

Sheriff Povero requested authorization for a budget transfer for reallocation of the FY09 Homeland Security law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program (LETPP).

**Supervisor Teed moved approval as requested by Sheriff Povero. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Luckern and carried unanimously.**

Sheriff Povero requested authorization for Acceptance of Bid for the Purchase of Law Enforcement Accessories and Leather Goods with United Uniform Company, Inc.; New York Police Supply, Inc.; Galls LLC; and Lawmen's Shooters Supply, Inc. for the period of one year.

**Supervisor Green moved approval of as requested by Sheriff Povero. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Luckern and carried unanimously.**

Sheriff Povero requested authorization for a resolution Recognizing National Public Safety Telecommunicators Week April 8-14, 2012.

**Supervisor Teed moved approval as requested by Sheriff Povero. Motion was seconded by Supervisor Luckern and carried unanimously.**

The last item on the agenda was a letter submitted for information only by Chairman Fafinksi from the Victim Resource Center of the Finger Lakes, Inc.

**Supervisor Green moved to close the regular meeting to go into Executive Session at 2:35 p.m. to discuss matters of litigation. Supervisor Champlin seconded the motion, carried unanimously.**

**Supervisor Luckern moved to close the Executive Session at 3:35 p.m. to return to the regular meeting. Motion was seconded the Supervisor Teed, and carried unanimously.**

**Supervisor Luckern moved approval of a resolution that Ontario County schedule a Public Hearing to be held in a location within Ontario County that is convenient to the citizens of the Town of Italy as part of the "balancing test" ordered by Judge Falvey of the Yates County Supreme Court and that the County Administrator be directed to write a letter to the Town of Italy Board with copies to the media about the project and the County's position. Supervisor Teed seconded the motion, carried unanimously.**

Supervisor Ninestine requested that County Administrator Garvey or Assistant County Attorney Schoeneman inform Supervisor John Cowley about the resolution as it relates to Naples.

**Supervisor Champlin moved to adjourn at 3:39 p.m. Supervisor Teed seconded the motion, carried unanimously.**
